STAGE 1	 PREVENTION: No confirmed cases of COVID-19 among staff or students Health prevention measures are in place Daily intensive cleaning and frequent cleaning of facilities No or limited visitor access Monitoring of virus trends in the community via local health officials Communicate to employees and district community
STAGE 2	 MITIGATION: One or more confirmed case(s) of COVID-19 at one facility. Person(s) with close contact of an individual with a confirmed case of COVID-19 will be advised to self-quarantine for 14 days (per Health authorities) Affected area is closed for deep cleaning Self-monitoring, preventative measure and stay home if ill No visitor access Communicate to employees and district community
STAGE 3	 MODIFIED OPERATIONS: Three or more confirmed COVID-19 cases in one specific area or campus. Students and staff of that area may need to self-quarantine for 14 days. Students impacted will move to remote learning from home Affected area will be closed for deep cleaning Self-monitoring, preventative measures and stay home if ill No visitor access on open campuses Communicate to employees and district community
STAGE 4	 CAMPUS CLOSURE: COVID-19 cases exceed 10% of facility occupancy. Entire campus will be closed for a minimum of two days Students and staff may return if symptom free upon determination by the school district administration and health authorities Those in close contact with the confirmed COVID-19 positive person(s) will quarantine for 14 days per CDC No visitor access on open campuses Communication to employees and community with health monitoring guidelines.
STAGE 5	 DISTRICT CLOSURE: COVID-19 cases exceed 10% occupancy within ALL campuses. All Lorenzo ISD facilities closed for a time determined by Health Dept. Students and staff move to remote learning and work All facilities and buses are deep cleaned and disinfected All areas, such as playgrounds, gyms, and athletic facilities are closed Extracurricular activities, contests, trips, events will be cancelled Communicate to employees and district community

This chart serves as a guide for decision making for COVID-19. Understanding that things can change rapidly, decisions may be adjusted as the situation is fluid. If cases are isolated to a specific grade or program, a more isolated approach may be adopted. Any Governor's Order supersedes this chart.
